Junior Hibernians Play Soccer in Ireland

The East Islip Warriors, Boys U-13 soccer team traveled to Ireland on Easter Sunday April 8th to play three matches on Irish soil. The team is part of the East Islip Soccer Club, John Davis President. Three of the lads on the squad are members of Our Lady of Knock, Division Seven, Junior Hibernians. John Hanley Jr. is the President, Connor Bermingham is the Vice President and Eammon Marquardt is the Recording Secretary. Also on the team is Joseph Quinn whose Grandfather and Uncle are members and surely there are other connections to the AOH on the team.

Though they did not win a match they acquitted themselves handsomely, fought hard and won the respect of the opposing players, coaches, trainers and spectators. The parents who accompanied them were particularly proud of our boy's in the first match they played. The teams coach Steven Bermingham who originally hails from the Northside region of Dublin, Coolock, arranged to play his youth soccer side Saint Columbians at the Oscar Traynor Development Centre. This match was well attended by the local community for they realized that they would see some good "football" and also participate in a presentation of money raised by parents and boys on the American side, the Irish side and Steve's family. Steven and his family thoughtfully decided to raise money for the Saint Francis Hospice that so helped his father, Charlie, and his family during his final illness. The director of the Hospice was pleased to receive a healthy donation from Steve, Connor, his mother and sisters. The director personally thanked every boy and parent.

The team played a tightly contested match the next evening, in Limerick, against the Shelbourne Football Club in which John Hanley Jr. scored on a penalty kick. The following morn the team had the opportunity to take a few days to visit Ireland. They took in the awesome Cliffs of Moher, toured Dingle Peninsula, visited Bunratty Castle, kissed the Blarney Stone and hiked in Killarney National Forest. The Lord was watching over us for we had some rain to let us know what Ireland is all about but it ceased when we were outside for the main part. The breakfasts were massive, the lunches and dinners were great and the libations weren't half bad either.

The final match was back in Dublin at the Oscar Traynor Centre again. The boys received instruction and an hour of training from four professional trainers who had also worked with them prior to the first match. The Centre is a first class football facility. The team learned a lot from this excellent instruction. The side they played was the North Dublin Schoolboys & Girls League Academy. We played their select team which is the cream of the crop of U-12 Dublin footballers. The Warrior's captain for this match, Dougie Carpluck, rattled the crossbar with a screaming shot in the first twelve minutes of the match but it failed to get in the net. The half ended in a 0-0 standoff. East Islip had opportunities in the second half but just couldn't convert and the Dublin side with some slick play came away with a 2-0 victory.

After all the matches we were treated royally and had a nice spread of food and drink laid out for us. The NDSL team is contemplating coming to East Islip to play some matches and we hope we can return the favor, by beating their team on our pitch and be as good a host as they were. The people of Ireland provided a great time for our sons and we thank them from the bottom of our hearts for that.
