

Saint Brigid

Saint Brigid is Ireland's female patron Saint - (St. Patrick being the better known male patron Saint). Her feast day, La Feile Brighde, is celebrated at the beginning of February, and marks the onset of Spring. St Brigid represents the Earth Mother and the Celts viewed her day as marking the time seeds stirred in the earth, when milk was produced by ewes for Spring lambs, and longer hours of daylight began to brighten the dark Winter days. They called this season Imbolc and it was celebrated across Europe. St Brigid's day marks the beginning of this season, celebrated by Christians as Candlemas, and marked by the lighting of Candles at midnight, to beckon in the brighter Spring days. St. Brigid founded her monastery in Kildare, near Dublin, about 460 AD, and there, an eternal flame was tended by 19 nuns. Her simple Rush Cross is probably Ireland's best known symbol, after the Shamrock and the Harp. The Brigid's Cross, aside from its religious significance, was also a totem for success in farming, and health in one's house, and a portent of plenty for the rest of the year!


