Why was this incident so sensitive to the U.S. military? Because on that day America lost one of the greatest fighter pilots in its history. Major Thomas B. McGuire, Jr. aged 24 from Ridgewood, New Jersey. Major McGuire was the top ace of the 475th Fighter Group of the Fifth Fighter Command with 38 confirmed aerial victories. He ranked second only to Major Richard I. Bong who had been credited with 40 victories. At the time of his death Major McGuire was the highest scoring American ace still involved in air combat against the enemy. At war's end Major McGuire's total of 38 victories would place him as the second leading American ace of World War II. Major McGuire was also one of the highest decorated pilots during WW II and was posthumously awarded the nation's highest award, the Congressional

The news of this dogfight devastated the morale of the American fighter pilots prosecuting the war against the Japanese. The top Army brass imme-

Right to Life Announcement

A Gallup Poll released May 15, 2009 found that 51 per cent of Americans now call themselves pro-life rather than pro-choice on the issue of abortion, the first time a majority gave that answer in the 15 years that Gallup asked the question. In addition the Pew Research Center found a reduction since August, 2008 in those saying abortion should be legal in all or most cases from 54 per cent to 46 per cent. Taken together, the two polls have elated anti-abortion activists, who had been stung by the November election results that placed President Barack Obama and other abortion-rights supporters in power in Washington.
