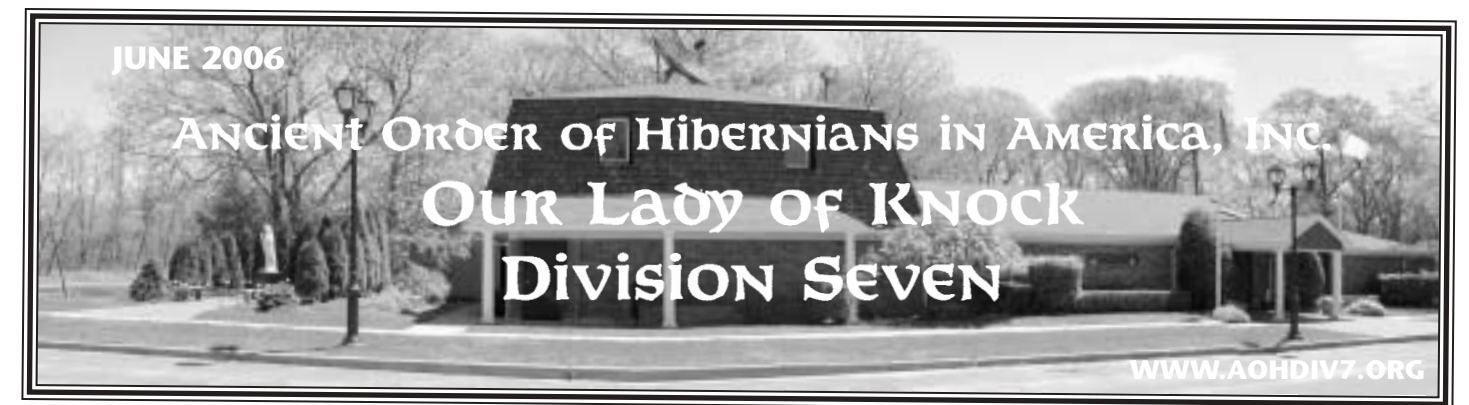

In signing the abortion ban, Governor Mike Rounds said, "A true test of a civilization is how well people treat the most vulnerable and the most helpless persons in their society."

HIGH COURT EXONERATES PRO-LIFER
After almost 20 years of legal harassment by the National Association of Women (N.O.W.), pro-life activist Joe Scheidler won. The U.S. Supreme Court by a 8-0 vote recently found Mr. Scheidler not guilty of Federal Extortion and Racketeering laws. The Court ruled that it found no proof the pro-life protestors intended to obtain property from abortions rights activists.
