





The good nuns of the Sisters of Charity were in the middle, acting as a buffer zone.

## **Calling Post**

Division 7 has a process for sending out announcements that are of importance and cannot wait until a regularly scheduled meeting.

Since not everyone visits the hall on a daily basis, it was decided by the Division Officers that we would use the services of an organization called 'Calling Post'.

This is a strictly voluntary call alerting notification system and is fundamentally non intrusive.

You will have to provide the Division with your phone number. Phone numbers are kept confidential and they will not be distributed.

If there is a message, it will be preceded by a five second announcement such as; "This is your Division President, Vic Vogel....".

If the phone is busy, the system will attempt to reach the caller with further attempts.

If your phone is set up to receive a message, such as an answering machine, it will leave a message on that machine.

CallingPost messages cannot be delivered to a phone system that requires the entering of an extension number or forwarding by a person.

Messages are delivered only between the hours of 9AM to 9PM.

Messages are approximately sixty seconds in total.

Again, this is voluntary and you can withdraw from the service at any time.

This service is available to paid up members and will be terminated if the dues are not current.
