

President's Message

Congratulations to the newly elected Corporation. President Gene Hearl, Vice President Dan Kissane, Secretary John Davis and Treasurer Dave Dinota have hit the ground running with their NFL Sunday Football Specials in the Tap Room and promise more innovative ideas. We wish you good luck and success.

We would like the thank the outgoing Corporation for their dedication and commitment. President Vin Clancy, Vice President Don Dobbin, Secretary Dan Sullivan and Treasurer Al Norton have served the division for many years. Thank you for the endless hours of hard work!

The Officers of Division 7 would like to announce a plan we have developed to combat the current economic dilemma in which find ourselves. It is our goal to promote the financial security of our division while, at the same time, maintaining all of our religious, cultural and social activities. On this plan, we are in unanimous agreement.

First, our newsletter will now be published bi-monthly until next summer. During that time, we will be working diligently to provide the capability of having our newsletter delivered by alternative means. With your help, the newsletter will be sent by electronic mail, posted on the division website and printed in limited quantities for display in our hall. This method will also allow us to effectively update news and inform members of events at a more frequent rate while, at the same time, providing us with a substantial savings. Advertisers will be pleased to know that our newsletter will be sent, not only to members of our division, but to all divisions in Suffolk County. We would like to thank Tom McHugh and Al Norton for their expertise in helping us move forward with this plan.

Next, it has become necessary to raise the annual membership dues in order to bring them into alignment with the new and anticipated assessments from the National, State and County Boards. Beginning January 2011, dues will be \$60 if paid by St. Patrick's Day. Any member paying dues after March 17th will be reassessed at a rate of \$100. It is hoped that this policy will encourage delinquent members to be more diligent in paying their dues promptly.

As discussed at our October meeting, Division 7 has, in the past, paid assessments to the National, State and County Boards for members who were as much as two years delinquent in their dues. The reimbursement of back dues may become a deciding factor as to whether a member wants to continue to be a Hibernian. When they decide to drop out, we lose financially. Therefore, effective January 1, 2011, any member who is delinquent in paying their 2010 dues will be considered lapsed and dropped from the membership. A member who has lapsed may be reinstated once he pays his back dues and any fees imposed by the National Board. This means that Division 7 is no longer paying assessments to superior jurisdictions for members who are in arrears. Again, this will create a significant savings our division.

In addition, the Officers of Division 7 feel that we can reduce budgetary items without effecting the quality of our religious, cultural and social events. One of our first decisions after being installed as division officers was to ask each chairman of a funded activity

to reduce the expenses of his event by a minimum of 10%. Examples of this effort would be the John P. Reilly - East Islip St. Patrick's Parade, the Family Picnic and the Division 7 Scholarship. We would like to thank Chairmen Dr. Dave Ring, Tom Snyder and Tom McEnroe for their cooperation in accomplishing this goal and maintaining the same quality that we expect. We will continue to oversee all budgets with the intention of cutting cost.

Furthermore, we are looking into alternative sources of funding for Division 7. The recently successful Garage Sale is an example of an innovative idea that has increased our revenues. We would like to thank Larry Wolff for his initiative.

Another source of funding was a private donation that was made to allay the cost of the Mass for Deceased Members. We would like to thank John Owen, Ed Smith and Leslie Lanigan for their efforts in making this possible. Perhaps private donations might be the way for our division to continue the charitable works for which we have been honorably recognized by the National and State Boards.
